

RECTOR'S LETTER



My dear friends,

We have also continued our regular Sunday morning worship services both on-line and in-person. Grace and peace to you all in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ. As we come together for our 2021 Annual Meeting, I would like to express my gratitude and delight in serving as Curate here at Saint John's! While no one anticipates beginning a new call to the priesthood amidst a global pandemic, you have all helped to make this a season of joy, wonder, and appreciation for all of God's mercies.

One of the gifts of St. John's is our amazing staff, and especially our Rector, Father Mark, who has nurtured an environment of creativity and mutual sharing. As a result, our social media presence has blossomed on Instagram and Facebook. We completed a significant assessment of our



formation and educational programming, particularly as it applies to children and families that will help us to provide the best worship and formation experiences for our entire St. John's Community in the very near future!

In addition, this year, we offered a robust calendar of Lenten and Holy Week offerings, which included a weekly on-line worship and formation experience that focused on Ignatian Prayer practices. And all of that led us to a spirit-filled day of in-person worship on Easter Sunday as we celebrated the resurrection of Jesus Christ, but also a type of resurrection of St John's as we gathered after a long year of absence!

Following the success of our Ignatian Prayer Series this Lent, we now invite parishioners of all ages to join us for our new "Faith and Families" Spiritual Formation Series on the first Wednesday of the month throughout Summer, 2021. The purpose of this program is to help our St. John's members reintegrate as a part of a community of faith, learn about foundations of our life as Episcopalians, and join together for some much-needed fellowship and fun.

We also anticipate the re-launch of St. John's for Kids Children's Chapel in the Fall! Many of our families, particularly those with young children have expressed their interest in returning to in-person worship, and we look forward to making that service available once again! We are also working to re-imagine how we will provide children and youth formation in an engaging and meaningful way for little ones, middles, teenagers and young adults. Much more to come in the Summer and Fall, so please stay tuned!

Finally, the ongoing pandemic has revealed many of the ways we struggle with the idea and practice of "wellness" in our communities. The term itself can be ambiguous, but in our St. John's context, wellness means a condition of physical, spiritual, psycho-social, vocational, and financial wholeness. Therefore, St. John's of Lattingtown has committed to launching a Wellness ministry that encompasses all five of these components, with offerings for individuals and families by developing partnerships with members of our community. We look forward to providing more information about this exciting ministry in the coming months!

I hope you can see what an exciting time it is for us here at St. John's of Lattingtown! There are so many ways to get involved and our amazing staff is ready to help you get connected! May we all give thanks to God for the many blessings of this wonderful faith community, and may we continue to go forth, rejoicing in the power of the Spirit! Alleluia! Alleluia!

2020 - 2021 MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS - St. John's of Lattingtown



The Rev'd Catherine Wieczorek— On October 1, 2021, we welcomed our new Curate, Mo Catherine! She and her family, husband Scott, daughters Charlotte and Ellie, and dogs Angel and Otis are a wonderful addition to our St. John's Family. We were privileged to host her ordination on September 26, 2020. She has quickly become involved in all aspects of our church, with a focus on Adult Formation, Outreach, our Children's Ministry and the development and implementation of our new Wellness Ministry.

The Music Program – Our talented Choral Scholar program, (for high school and college students) continued this year, first via Zoom, and now in person. We look forward to resuming the Junior Choral Scholar Program (ages 3rd grade and up) with the children and youth at Glen Gardens in the very near future.

Little Learner's Playgroup – As we adjust to the ever changing needs and environment, Little Learner's playgroup continues to grow and thrive. They will offer a summer program during the months of June and July, and look forward to full capacity this September.

Outreach Ministries- Courtney Callahan, founding member of NOSH, a community organization of many volunteers formed during the pandemic to serve the food insecure on the North Shore of LI, has helped oversee this organization feed more than 600 families! In addition, a youth internship program called NOSHKids, as well as other initiatives, will continue this summer.

St John's 68th Country Fair Our annual event continues to support community awareness and raise funds for many parish and local programs. In 2021, we will be back! There will be new and exciting changes to engage all ages - mark you calendars for the weekend of September 24th–26th, 2021! More news and details coming soon.

Spiritual Enrichment – We are thrilled that our Sunday services are back in person (with protocols). We offered a powerful Lenten Wednesdays Ignatian Prayer series via zoom, and a complete Holy Week in person and online schedule, followed by three Easter services and our annual Easter egg hunt. By popular demand, beginning May 30th, we will relocate our 10:30 am Holy Eucharist Rite II service to our beautiful Memorial Garden at 9:30 am for the summer. We also livestream on Sunday morning at 10:30 am, for any who prefer to watch us from home. In addition, our weekday services include Monday Morning Prayer at 8:30 am in the church and on Instagram, Wednesday Healing Service at 12 noon in the church and Weekly Devotions on Instagram and Face Book. Individual Spiritual Direction with

Mother Catherine began in March and on May 5th at 6:00 pm via Zoom, we will implement a new "Faith and Family" on the first Wednesday of each month, both part of our new Wellness Ministry.

Sunday School – we transitioned our traditional Sunday School to an online *Insta Chapel* for families via Instagram during the pandemic. We were able to return to our traditional in person Sunday School in July. Our beloved Christingle Christmas Pageant became a movie this year! Our families and friends completely embraced this new format– and our movie debuted just before Christmas! This Easter, we shared our annual



Easter Egg Hunt in the Memorial Garden with many families! Our 2020 confirmation class of 12 candidates were confirmed here at St. John's on April 28, 2021. We will introduce our Sunday School summer schedule with an new curriculum soon.

Church- beautiful upgrades to the altar lighting offer a magnificent view of our gorgeous wood carvings.

Our red altar frontal was hand repaired by Suzi Chase. More improvements are planned for this year!.

Memorial Garden- the landscaping and plantings continue to display the serenity of our place of rest and reflection. This year longtime member Suzanne Dillenbeck, donated a beautiful marble bench, loving known as "the blessing bench" to welcome all at the entrance of the allee.

The Barn- has flourished and a become a tremendous asset to our church and surrounding community. We will have our season's Grand Opening on May 23, at 10:00 am! Kate Scefonas (General Manager) along with volunteers Cynthia Murray, Amanda Essex, Bumble Ingham, Jo Ann Browne and many others have renovated the area to include more space and upgrades. The Barn continues to offer more quality, donated, gently used items at a steep discount.

Technology– New state of art Livestream capabilities have helped us to bring our message literally around the world! Sunday services, weddings, funerals, and other church events can be viewed live and are taped for future viewing. We have a developed a tremendous following on both our Face Book and Instagram accounts!

Flags—our new American and Episcopal Flags were raised by Rich Hagner, just in time for the Easter services. We thank Rich for heading this important ministry.

Cloister— to honor the memory of our beloved Lel Gimbel, the cloister will be enhanced with many new flowers and plants to offer a special place of solitude and beauty. All of the work and proceeds are donated by members of the Altar Guild and many of Lel's friends.



There is little question that 2021 will be marked as a seminal year in the one-hundred- and six-year history of St. Johns of Lattingtown, a year that tested the character of our congregation and the strength of our resolve. Despite the challenges presented by the global pandemic, we persevered, passionately pursuing each of our ministries and serving our community. As we now emerge and the days grow brighter, we are confident we do so with an even firmer foundation – we are excited about the days ahead!

With great leadership, over this past year, we lived our values and delivered on our missions. Our shepherds, Father Mark and Mother Catherine adapted and evolved our entire host of service offerings, implementing technology to allow our congregation to remain connected irrespective of the ever-changing health conditions and protocols. Miss Courtney reframed and extended the spiritual support of our children and inspired our congregation to engage deeply with those in need throughout our community, in particular addressing food insecurity through NOSH. Likewise, Chris Brayne's Choral Scholars program continues to mentor the beautiful voices of young women and men that bless our ears each Sunday, at Evensongs, and other special offerings. We are so fortunate to have each of them in our lives, it is their vision and dedication that blesses our congregation every day.

A silver lining of this dark period has been the consequent reflection on each of our missions and the ways in which they are achieved. Our clergy have spent much time evaluating our programming to be certain it is meeting the expectations of our congregation and community, across all generations. We are pleased and encouraged by the new offerings and opportunities to engage with our spirituality and one another that have been introduced over this past year and very well received. We have elevated our programming and emerge stronger. For example, learning through the challenges, we discovered how popular 10:30am services in our Memorial Garden could be and will be bringing them back this Spring. After months of outstanding online services, we saw two "sold out" in-person Holy Eucharist Easter services and the return of our Easter egg hunt filled with happy (and masked) children scampering about searching for chocolate eggs. Our Social Media messaging has found its voice and is spiritually purposeful to a great end - increasing daily with followers from within our congregation and beyond. Our calendar is filling-up with baptisms, weddings and a full confirmation class to be confirmed next month. Indeed, throughout Summer and into Fall we are excited by the additional programs slated for introduction, providing outlets and spiritual nourishment, and meeting our families where they are. It is our belief, this is a strong foundation for a healthy congregation and look forward to its continued enrichment.











BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS




MISSION STATEMENT
