


As I often quote from my dear friend Fr. Ian Cron, an Episcopal priest from Nashville, TN, he speaks and writes a lot about leadership and the life of St Francis of Assisi. In his book, Ian puts forth an interesting parallel I would like for St. John's to think about. Francis' 12th century world faced challenges of modernity vs. post-modernity, like ours. The Church had lost all credibility with untrustworthy leaders, had become very political, and was irrelevant for those who were seeking God. But, just when the Church was at an all-time low, along came St. Francis to save her.

How did he do it? Francis became the change he envisioned. He didn't wait around for someone else to tell him what to become, or do. He did it. Francis lived out, what Mahatma Gandhi would say and do, over 800 years later: "Be the Change you wish to See!" Do It.

If you want to see St. John's of Lattingtown, your spiritual home, live and be here for those who are to come after us, then you and I have an important role right now, and that is to help shape ministry for others.

If you wish to see music, youth, seniors, rich, poor, black, white, gay, straight, become more and more a part of this community, and that means who we are and what we stand for, then now is the time: "to be the change you wish to see!" We are here to become disciples of Jesus Christ.

As Rector, I need your help to be this change! But, most importantly, God needs you, because, together we are the Body of Christ!





CURATE'S LETTER

Dear St. John's of Lattingtown,

Grace and peace to you all in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ. As we come together for our 2022 Annual Meeting, I would like to express my gratitude and delight in serving as Curate here at Saint John's! Reflecting on this last year makes me realize how blessed we are as a staff by you, our St. John's community. Despite the many challenges and with the ups and downs of COVID, our parish family has continued to come through with grace and love.

In the Summer of 2021, we launched our "Faith and Families" Spiritual Formation Series, which was offered virtually on the first Wednesday of the month. The purpose of this program was to help



our St. John's members reintegrate as a part of a community of faith, learn about foundations of our life as Episcopalians, and join together for some much-needed fellowship and fun.

In the Fall, we were overjoyed to see the return of our St. John's for Kids Family Service! Families of all types, but especially those with small children, participate in this vibrant service each week, which includes a child-friendly message, music specially written by Mr. B, and Holy Communion that invites children to the altar to interact with the priest during the Eucharistic prayers.

Father Mark has continued to nurture an environment of creativity and mutual sharing. As a result, we have been able to provide numerous adult formation offerings, such as Contemplative Evening Prayer in Advent, as well as an Advent "Retreat Day." We also embarked on an incredible journey through the Lenten Season with our congregation-wide art project, which culminated in an exposition on April 24th that featured the work of talented children, community artwork, and individual contributions. We now have a complete set of the Stations of the Cross that is uniquely St. John's that we hope will inform and inspire generations to come.



We have so much more to look forward to in the coming year! Our new Alpha Course begins on Wednesday, May 11th in conjunction with members of the Reformed Church of Locust Valley. Alpha is a series of conversations focused on the questions of life, faith, and meaning. Each session includes a time to connect with others, hear a talk on some element of faith, and then a chance for people to share their own questions and perspectives with the group. 2021 - 2022 MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS - St. John's of Lattingtown

The Music Program - Our Choral Scholar program, promoting and supporting vocal music education for high school and college students under the direction of Chris Brayne, featured a joint program with Christ Church Manhasset, and a Lenten Love Song concert. In addition, Chris organized and performed a moving musical devotion for Lent, "Via Crucis". The Junior Choral Scholar Program (ages 3rd grade and up) with the children and youth at Glen Gardens will resume on Monday evenings. This year, the music program added a Children's' Choir with Mr. Chris- a short burst of music after the 9:00 am St John's for Kids Service teaching traditional Episcopalian hymns.

Little Learner's Playgroup - Little Learner's playgroup, led by Director Jenn Strazzeri and Assistant Director Lisa Formicola, continues to grow and thrive and classes are filled to capacity! Their curriculum has




expanded to include an outside enrichment program several days a week. The summer program features a great schedule of fun during the months of June and July.


Outreach Ministries - Our Outreach Ministries have expanded and include many different groups helping to support and serve the needs of our community: Thistle and Spoon-supplied meals to the Transition Home in Glen Cove, Glen Gardens Ministries-hosted many wonderful events with our friends at Glen Gardens- including a back pack giveaway, pop up clothes tents and our famous Old Fashioned Christmas Party, Thanksgiving and Christmas Boxes

Ministry –filled and delivered dinners for friends during the holidays, Friends of St John's—arranged toiletry tote bags and prepared Easter dinner boxes, Airlift of Love sent skates and clothes to children in the Dakotas, and new this year we began the Helping Hands Ministry - to support those who cannot attend regular services,

Karing Kids Children's Ministry - collected toys for autistic children (with more events planned) and we are in the process of establishing a new Full Circle Community Outreach Ministry—to focus on those in assisted living/nursing homes. Several weeks ago, we began "Faith out Front" with a table on the patio after the 10:30 am service- to help introduce all of the ministries at St John's! Come and see all that we do!

Wellness Ministry - We are excited to announce many additions to our new Wellness Ministry! Cairn, established by Bethany Kelsey, Heather Robinson, and Hanna Rubinstein has generously provided us with yoga classes and a wonderful newsletter (edited by our own Claudine Baldwin) .We now provide family counseling services with Patricia Hidalgo, LCSW- her office is on campus and open several days a week. Wednesday Healing Service at 12 noon in the church continues in person and online. Mo. Catherine is

available for individual spiritual direction, by appointment. Our Fr Mark's *Fitzhugh Fridays* (on Instagram and Facebook) weekly messages of hope and faith, with a dose of Fr Mark's Southern charm, are a huge hit! We also have two weekly AA Meetings in the Parish Hall, held on Tuesdays at 8:00 pm and Saturdays at 9:30 am.

Sunday School - Sunday School has returned in person! We have added an Outreach component each week for kids- to help support community needs. Our children participated in the Lenten Art project, designing their own beautiful Stations of the Cross. The confirmation class of fourteen candidates will be confirmed here at St. John's on May 22, 2022. Our Jr Acolyte Program has returned, with 15 children, both new and alumni, serving at our services every Sunday! Monday Nights Lights program returns again in June, with sports, games, dinner and a spiritual component! A new program for the younger kids – Monday Afternoon Lights- begins on May 2nd, featuring fun programming



with the Nature Preserve, book time with local authors and even a Dinosaur Ball! On June 5th, we will have our first "Receiving Day"- for baptized youth (and adults) receiving the Eucharist for the first time, or for those already receiving to celebrate and participate fully in the Eucharist.

Buildings and Grounds - Our beloved Memorial Garden has been reseeded and new trees have been planted around the exterior. The Lel Gimbel Cloister project is nearing completion. The altar lighting has been up-



graded and the altar floor has been restored. We have been working with FEMA to qualify for funding to help us pay for repairs to the nursery school as a result of Hurricane Ida last September. Projects planned for this year include improving the parking lot on Lattingtown Road, addressing our dated boiler and updating the lighting in the choir loft.

The Barn - Our version of a "thrift store" has flourished and is a tremendous asset to our church! Although closed for the winter, sales continue to thrive through Instagram and Facebook! We will have this year's Grand Opening on May 15th. Kate Scefonas (General Manager) along with volunteers Cynthia Murray, Amanda Essex, Bumble Ingham, Jo Ann Browne and others have created a community treas-

ure with quality, donated, gently used furniture, clothing, and much more available at a huge discount.

Social Media/Website - We continue to have a strong social media presence on Instagram and Facebook thanks to the talented and innovative Courtney Callahan, posting daily, with over 1,000 followers! Our website is updated frequently with new offerings and programs, including many options to help support St John's!

Spiritual Formation - This year we offered a Faith & Family summer online series, Advent Contemplative Prayer series, a Vestry Retreat, Lenten Art Project, and in May, Alpha, an adult formation series, begins. Our Faith Matters bible study is available every Sunday at 9:30 am and the Nurture (Prayer Group) meets on Mondays at 10:00 am.

New Sexton! - Please welcome our new Sexton, Mat Stimola (*pictured right*). Yes, the name is familiar- he is George Stimola's brother and we are thrilled to have him join Frank Powers, who continues to assist us on weekends, and complete our staff!



This past year was distinguished by the joyful return to church and to one another. We opened our doors and our fields and welcomed back our parishioners and our neighbors, alike. St. John's is as vibrant a church as ever. Thanks to the work of our Ministry leadership, first-class staff, and so many caring and enthusiastic volunteers, we can wholeheartedly say we are following faithfully in Christ's footsteps.

This was perhaps never more evident than at this past season's Country Fair – a reimagined opening night party filled with friends and neighbors followed by two days of activities and worship on our great lawn. It was one of our most successful fund-raising and community driven events. Weddings were also a big hit at St. John's this year, with a record number celebrated and more to come in the year ahead. We are also pleased to know the Annual Gala will return this summer. Aided by these events and a strong economy, our endowment is the highest it's been in history.

Under Father Mark's and Mother Catherine's leadership we are well positioned to take the next step. We are blessed with incredible Vestry, Ministry leaders and staff. The Music Ministry – we have had a challenging year with pandemic restrictions and restricted opportunity for recruitment.
